I didn't set out on this tour to solve the problems between our two countries. My main reason for doing it was to create a basic trust between children. People always ask me "did you accomplish anything." Of course nuclear weapons aren't going to be stopped because of PEACE CHILD. Caitlin Siegel, Katya of the Peace Child Players Company, wrote:

"What I got from "PEACE CHILD" was a message of hope for my future: a message that allowed me to stop walking alone and frightened with blinders on; to turn and look around, - see the world as we know it now, and then imagine how it could be. To always keep ahead of you the thought that the world can be saved; to stop dividing people into different races and come to the human race; to face the problems of today and tomorrow together, while learning from the mistakes of yesterday so they won't be repeated. A CATALYST FOR WORLD PEACE

"PEACE CHILD" was born in London in 1981, the brainchild of a lady who wished an end to the negative protesting of the traditional peace movement. Eirwen Harbottle wanted a "Celebration of Peace" - a powerful affirmation of the peace we already have, and a positive search for less threatening means to secure it.

She brought together Peace Book author, Bernard Benson, with composer David Gordon, and persuaded her son-in-law, David Woollcombe, to write a script based on their combined work. The result was a show which made a strong appeal for expanded international communication through cultural and youth exchange.

Initially, the Soviets wanted nothing to do with the play. Americans on the other hand, were delighted by it. Following its magnificent premiere at the Kennedy Center, Washington DC in 1982, there were over 500 presentations of the show in 40 states.

In 1985, the occasion of the Moscow Youth Festival supplied an opportunity for the Foundation to mount a joint US-Soviet production of the show. Working intensively behind the scenes with a small band of Soviet enthusiasts, the show was eventually mounted in one of the best theatres in Moscow, and the Soviet-American cast performed extracts from the show on radio, TV and many different venues. The Russians were charmed: here were American and Soviet children singing and dancing happily together in a play that spoke to their deep thirst for peace. On the night that Soviet TV news ran an item on Peace Child, their switch-board became jammed with calls requesting a repeat of the piece.

"PEACE CHILD" was a smash hit in my home state of Minnesota two weeks ago. This is the first time that young people from both countries have performed together in the USA. We all hope that this beginning will lead to many more youth exchanges which would allow hundreds, and eventually thousands, of our youth to visit each other's countries."

In December 1985, the Peace Child Foundation created an historic re-union of the Soviet-American Cast in a satellite TV program dedicated to the spirit of Samantha Smith. The children sang songs and performed scenes together, talked with, waved at and wept with each other in an emotive program that was aired on over a hundred US TV stations, and was reported on 9 national TV news programs. It was hosted by John Denver.

On this program, the US children issued the invitation to their Soviet friends to bring their joint production to the USA. It was well known how unlikely this would be: almost no Soviet children had been allowed to taste forbidden fruit by travelling to the west. As Mr Gromyko once put it: "We do not wish our Soviet Youth to be exposed to your western decadence." The invitation was pointedly cut out of the version broadcast on Soviet TV.

Our Soviet team of enthusiasts remained undeterred. By a combination of luck, the chaos of change under Gorbachev's leadership, incredible hard-work and bullock-headed determination, a 12-city tour of the joint production was mounted in the USA in the fall of 1986.

"The significance of this production is that it is a joint venture - a cooperative effort in which our children have been living and working together, sharing experiences which will last a lifetime. I would like to congratulate the Peace Child Foundation and the members of the company.

The play was no longer merely fanciful: many of the scenes within it had become real. It could be put out to young people as a self-fulfilling prophecy that had already partially self-fulfilled.

On September 16th, the Day of Peace, the Soviet-American cast, along with a vast chorus of 500 Peace Children, stood on the steps of the United Nations singing their appeal to world leaders in an exact facsimile of what is written in the play. Impressed, the UN staff requested that the Peace Child Foundation develop ways in which the International Day of Peace could be celebrated around the world. They were inviting us to bring to life perhaps the most important component of the show: the setting of the play on a future international holiday known as 'Peace Day' - the title of the opening song. (See Part IV)

At that point we recognised what many of us had long suspected: that Peace Child has a special destiny in the world peace movement. Everything that had happened in our history had been something of a miracle. The lack of a solid funding base had always placed our very existence in jeopardy. And yet always we had pulled through.

This proposal outlines a strategy for creating a strong organisational and funding base so that the phenomenon of "Peace Child" can continue to work its magic around the world.



Mr. FASCELL. Mr. Speaker. I rise today to give recognition to a group whose work with children across America and around the world is helping to promote peace and harmony and build bridges across racial lines. The Peace Child Foundation brings children from diverse backgrounds together to work toward a common goal of creating and performing in a musical revue, combining and sharing their unique cultures and experiences.

The Peace Child Foundation is a nonprofit organization which acts as an umbrella for local groups in cities around the United States; helps them get started and gain sponsorship; and oversees the international projects of the foundation. The local groups bring children of different races together to create and perform a musical production extolling harmony and peace. Internationally, Peace Child selects American youth to join with children from other countries to perform and share their cultures and ideas. With these small steps, they are aiding in the peace process in a unique way.

I was recently fortunate enough to see "City at Peace," presented by the Miami branch of the Peace Child Foundation. It was comprised of 112 students who sang and danced their way into the audience's heart. They put their individual talents and interests together and produced a moving show, encompassing the ideals of peace and racial harmony, combined with an antidrug message. Through their effort and group commitment, these young people learned that although they come from different backgounds, they are all part of one community and can work together to create something truly special on their own. 

Currently, over 3,000 cities in the world are Nuclear Free Zones. In the United States, 118 cities and counties, 65 schools and 180 churches and synagogues have declared themselves Nuclear Free Zones. In a third of the American cities and counties, the Nuclear Free Zones are legally-binding ordinances, voted into being by the citizens or through the courageous actions of the city councils.

Our T-shirts say, "Let's Make the World a Nuclear Free Zone" in English, Russian, Chinese and French, (the languages used in the countries that have nuclear weapons). The words circle the

Dove of Peace.

Peace? It's up to you and me. We believe the spreading of nuclear free zones around the

world will help bring that wonderful world of peace that you and we desire.

As a member of the global peace community, I would like to thank you for the wonderful gift of the Peace Child. You have shared your very best with us -- your music, your capacity of bringing characters to life, your dancing, your production skills, your spontaneous good will. Most of all, you have shared your spirit, shared with us the universal hope that springs from every human heart -- the inner voice that says, "I want to live in peace with the rest of humanity, to smile and cry and laugh, to watch my children run and play, to raise a family and walk peacefully toward old age in harmony with all creation."

I am a member of a number of different peace groups, but consider myself first and foremost a children's peace activist. I believe with the birth of each generation we have a new opportunity to create a world of peace and justice, to create a generation which loves peace more than war, values sharing more than keeping, yearns for justice rather than oppression, and believes in conserving our one world's natural beauty for future generations.

Through the stories, I try to help children overcome their prejudices, control their anger, deal with their fears, and learn to take responsibility for the health of the planet.
