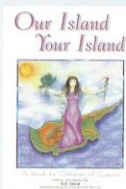

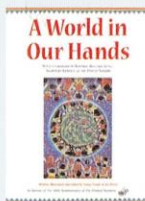

Mission: Empowering Young People

What is Peace Child?

Peace Child empowers young people to inform themselves and take action on major world issues. Registered in the UK as an educational charity, Peace Child also has consultative status at the UN for which it has done many projects. Since its founding in 1982 it has grown to include over 500 youth groups in 120 countries.

Peace Child's main work is to promote sustainable development by going into schools and training young people to be "Be the Change Ambassadors," to create youth publications, arrange congresses, stage musicals and fund local action projects. The Peace Child headquarters are at a residential centre near Cambridge in the UK. Here an international team of young volunteers work on projects and run the office together.



CURRENT PROJECTS INCLUDE:

Be the Change! The major outcome of our Millennium Young People's Congress in Hawaii in 1999, the programme enables young people worldwide to undertake community-based projects promoting sustainable development—environmental conservation and regeneration, education and health. BTC encourages schools in developed countries to adopt projects recommended by our field offices—in Peru, India, Kenya, Sierra Leone and Ghana — to link with projects in the developing world, giving both groups of young people a unique educational experience. Youth-created educational materials on key global issues:

After the success of our first book, *Rescue Mission: Planet Earth*, which sold 320,000 copies in 21 languages, Peace Child has created a whole series of books on human rights, the environment, sustainable development and the United Nations. All our publications and materials are designed to be entertaining and appealing to young people while also being informative enough to be used as classroom texts.

Be the Change! Ambassador Programme - Youth teaching youth about sustainable development:

This complex topic is introduced to young people in a lively and entertaining way. Peace Child's international team of volunteers go into schools and deliver assembly presentations using drama skits and powerpoint visuals,

followed by class-room games and exercises. Other students are also trained to become *Be the Change!* Ambassadors. An Ambassador Pack with a CD-ROM gives them all they need to make great presentations at schools and community groups. Funded by a 3-year grant from DEFRA's Environmental Action Fund this initiative empowers young people to become excellent peer educators.

World Youth Congress Series:

Following the success of the Millennium Young People's Congress, Hawaii, 1999 and the Morocco Congress in 2003, Peace Child now organises a biennial International Youth Congress to look at how young people may take on more challenges facing society. The Hawaii Congress focused on young people's priorities for the 21st Century; Morocco on their role in implementing the Millennium Development Goals. The Scottish congress (July 30th to August 8th 2005) will look at what makes young people want to volunteer. How do we include young people who opt out? The next will be in Bangalore, India in 2007 and the congress series will continue until at least 2015, the date by which the Millennium Development Goals should be achieved.

Internships: High school and university graduates with skills in design, IT, writing and editing, public communication skills and the management of grass roots organizations are encouraged to apply for internships at Peace Child headquarters, India and Peru. All interns need to speak good English.

School trips to India: Peace Child offers 2-3 week, individually-crafted school trips to India that include working on development projects, sight-seeing and an in-depth introduction to Indian culture and history. These trips are organized through our field office in Bangalore.



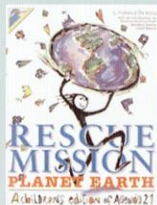

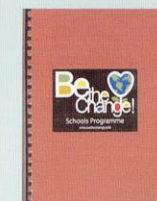

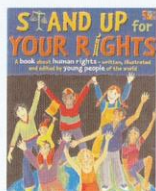


The Be the Change! Ambassador Pack

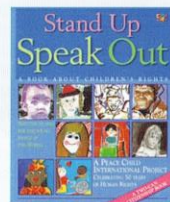
Stand Up! Speak Out—A Children's Book of Human Rights

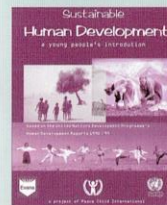
Geoactive CD-ROM

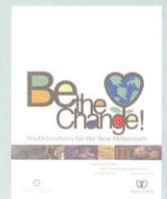


Sustainable Human Development

This book is our first student-created textbook and is designed to provide key reading texts on sustainable development for secondary schools for both Geography and Citizenship GCSE. 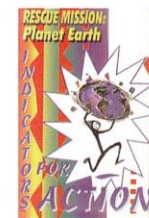
Peace Child 2000—new script, new study guide

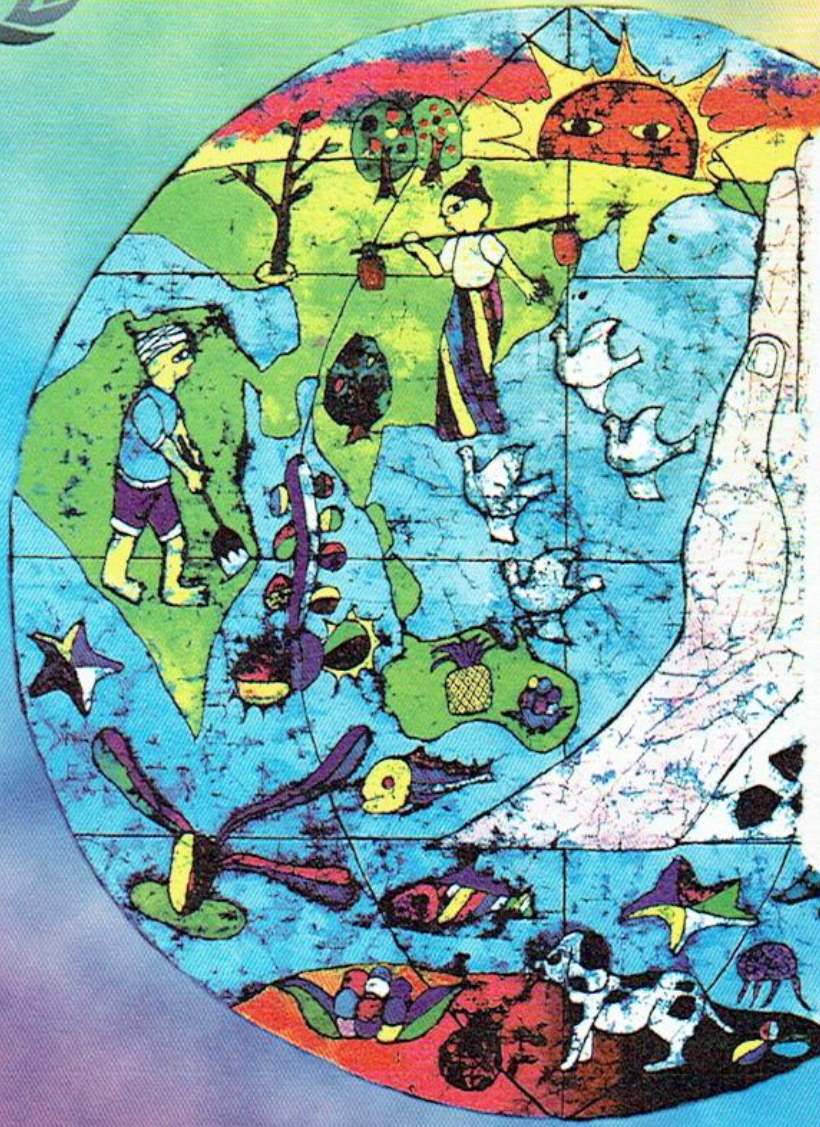

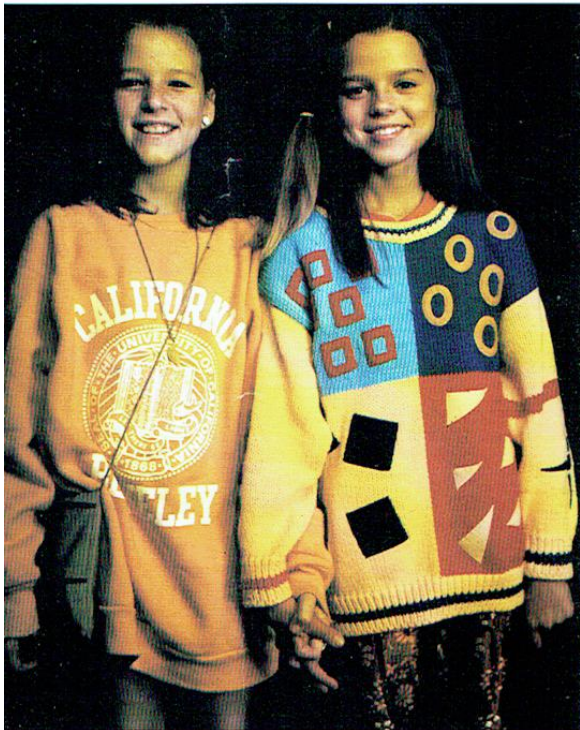

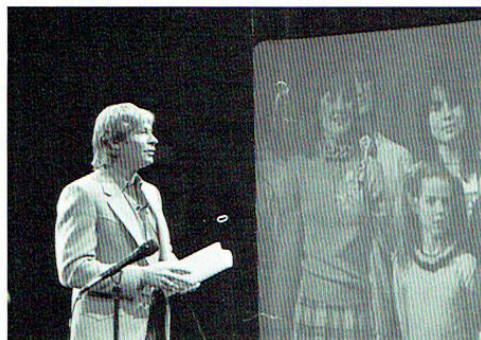

A Musical Play About Children Who Bring Peace to the World

The year is 2025.

It is Peace Day — a holiday to commemorate the day the nations of the world declared Peace. The festivities include a play which tells the story of how Peace Day came to be — how an American boy and a Soviet girl become friends and embark on an adventure to persuade their leaders to overcome their mistrust and break out of the vicious cycle of the arms race.

This is *Peace Child* — a deeply moving and empowering celebration of friendship, a glimpse of the dazzling future that the peoples of the world might create in partnership.

Peace Child was born in England in 1981, the product of a wish to do something constructive and celebratory for peace. It was immediately hailed as a fine new piece of children's theatre — a perfect play for school, community and amateur groups. There have already been more than 500 performances involving 10,000 children in the US. It was also recognized as an excellent tool for peace education, and an ideal vehicle for US-Soviet youth exchange.

The Peace Child Foundation was set up in 1982 to promote the play and seek Soviet participation in it. Miraculously, it succeeded: in July 1985, a joint US-Soviet production was presented in Moscow. In 1986, Soviet and American children toured the play to 12 American and 4 Soviet cities, becoming the first reciprocal US-Soviet youth exchange in history.

A Creative and Fun Way To Teach Peace

The setting of the play, on Peace Day 2025, never changes; the story of how Peace Day came about, can and does. The challenge that *Peace Child* presents to children is to imagine how to transform today's imperfect world into a future peaceful world. They are invited to become the Peace Children of the story — to rewrite the dialogue, invent new scenes and songs — so that by the end of the experience, they are empowered to believe that they can in fact transform their world.

The *Peace Child Study Guide* contains the basic script and score, and leads you step-by-step through the process. Each scene is followed by a lesson which gives background to the issues raised, and offers suggestions for research and rewriting. Video and audio cassettes, instrumental tracks, and a wealth of other support materials are available, as well as an experienced staff at the Foundation for further guidance.

An Expanding International Youth Exchange Program

The resolution of the *Peace Child* play has the children setting up a massive youth exchange system. The Peace Child Foundation is working to make this solution a reality by organizing an increasing number of youth exchange programs between the US, the USSR, and other nations.

Each program lasts about a month and is open to students aged 12-18. The first two weeks are spent writing and rehearsing a new version of *Peace Child*; the second two weeks are spent touring the show to 4 or 5 cities. The effort and intensity of creating the play, followed by the fun of touring, forms strong friendship and provides a wonderful way for children to experience another country.

The Foundation sponsored 3 exchange programs in 1987. For 1988, 10 programs are scheduled; 20 are planned for 1989. The Foundation also organizes family tours to the USSR for parents and friends of exchange students to meet the families of the Soviet students.

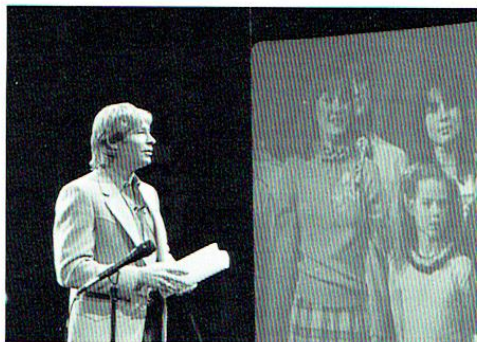
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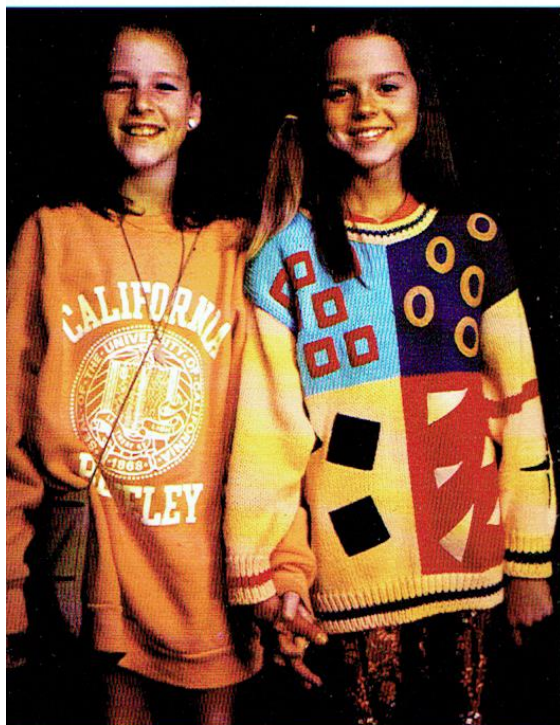

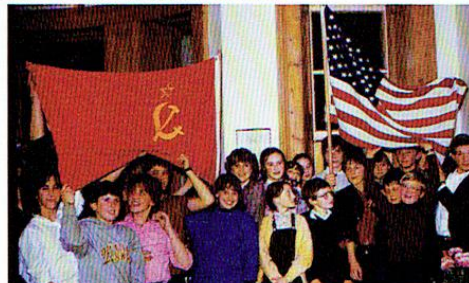
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
